

Color Mottling

1. Start by rolling a base coat of satin or semi-gloss latex paint on your walls in the lightest color you have chosen for your technique. Let dry four hours or overnight.
2. Pour your three chosen colors of latex paint into separate roller pans. (Add about 1 cup of glaze to each gallon of paint to make it flow a bit better.)
3. Using either brushes or mini rollers, apply large spots of each color to the wall randomly in about a 3ft area.
4. Pat and blend the colors into each other with a sea sponge or a lambs wool tool. Don't forget to tap color along the baseboards, trim and crown.
5. DON'T OVERWORK THE PAINT OR IT WILL BECOME MUDDY!!!

Note: If you see an area needs more of "this or that" color, **wait until the wall dries**, then apply the colors where needed.

Materials / Supplies

- Masking Gun
- Tape/Paper
- Drop cloths
- 3 Paint Pans
- Terry cloth towels
- Razor Knife
- 3 Brushes or 3 Mini-rollers
- Sponge or Lambs wool applicator
- 3 colors of satin sheen latex paints
- Glaze
